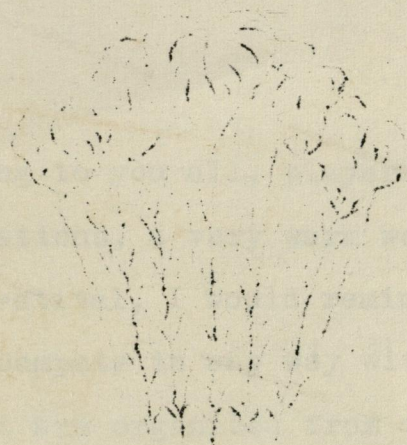


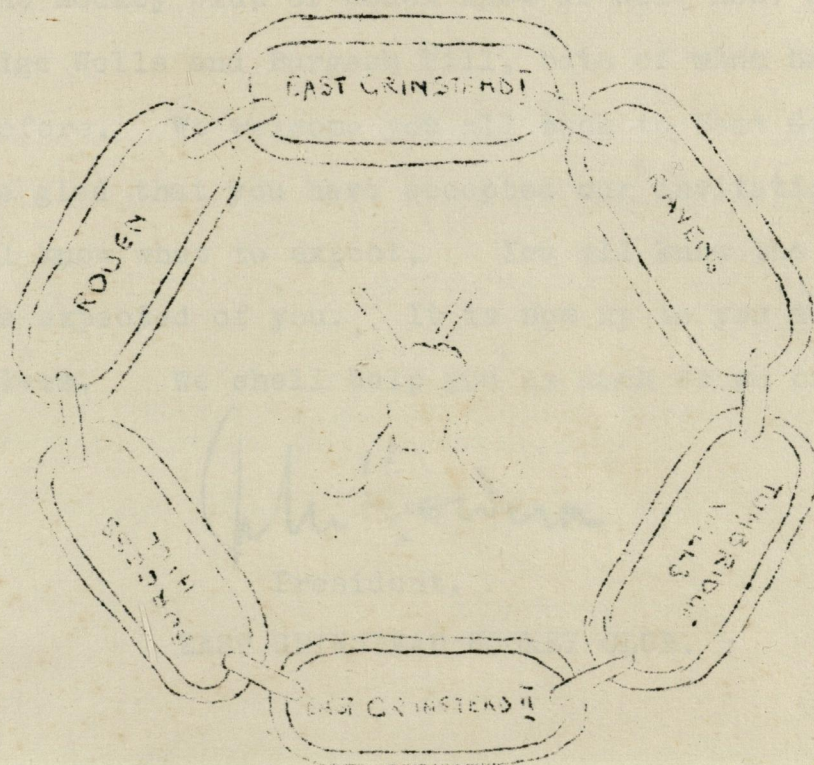



Choice of ends will be decided by the toss of a coin.
Choice of colours will be decided by mutual arrangement
between Captains.

All matches must start and finish on time, and players

minutes before their scheduled time for bully-off.

In the event of a tie for position at the end of the
tournament, goal average will be taken into consider-
ation to determine the winners.
