#### NOTES ON FESTIVAL

Normal Hockey Association rules will apply throughout the Festival, including the penalty flick.

In the event of colours clashing, the first-named team on the fixture list will wear their normal colours; the others having to change. It would be appreciated if Clubs provided their own balls for their games.

Lunches will be served at 1 p.m. each day for those who have booked them and for as many others as can be catered for. Would you please be sure to purchase your lunch tickets from the bar (3/6d. each) before sitting down.
