NOTES ON FESTIVAL

The Festival will take place at the Saint Hill Hockey Ground where there are four pitches. Only two will be used at any one time, the others being kept in reserve in the event of wet weather. Each game will be played 25 minutes each way, with five minutes for half-time and a five-minute interval between each game.

As we are sure everyone will appreciate, it is most vital to adhere very strictly to the times laid down and all games will start at the appointed time, regardless of whether there are full teams or not.

Normal Hockey Association rules will apply throughout the Festival.

In the event of colours clashing, the first-named team on the fixture list will wear their normal colours; the others having to change. It would be appreciated if Clubs provided their own balls for their games.

Lunches will be served in the marquee at 1 p.m. each day for those who have booked them and for as many others as can be catered for. Would you please be sure to purchase your lunch tickets (5/- each) before sitting down.

In order to assist the good ladies who are kindly providing these lunches please don't linger, as they have only a limited amount of cutlery, etc.!

For the Dance on Sunday Evening we would like to stress that no one will be allowed in without a ticket, and that there will be no tickets at the door, so please be sure to get these from John Malkin beforehand.

It is hoped to arrange one or two fixtures for the East Grinstead Boys Under-15 Side against the Ladies' teams.

These matches will be played at Saint Hill.
