

From this point the festival became 'triangular', with the three host clubs taking it in turn to host the festival.

The main tournament trophy for the men was presented by Flottbek in 1962 and was later rechristened in 1968 The Jacque Paloumé Trophy in memory of our great friend from Rouen who was tragically killed in a car accident.

The Mike Leman / Ian Westwood Cup

This is presented at each tournament in memory of Mike and Ian from East Grinstead who were tragically killed in a car accident in 1985. Mike and Ian were two great personalities of the festival and this Cup is presented to the person who in the opinion of the 3 Paloumé Team Captains the festival could not have taken place without.

Holder - Wulle (Flottbek)

Emilie Trophy

In memory of Emilie from Rouen.

Originally this trophy was to be for the best goalkeeper of the tournament. This has now changed and it is awarded to the person who in the opinion of the 3 Paloumé Team Captains has most entered into the spirit of the festival and interacted between teams.

Holder – Perky (EG)

Player of the Tournament

Voted for by the 3 Paloumé Team Captains. Holder – Hugo (Rouen)

Big Ben


